CONCISE EXPLANATION AND ANALYSIS OF THE PRODUCT AND ITS COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT, INCLUDING CORE PRINCIPLES AND THE COMMISSION'S REGULATIONS THEREUNDER

Pursuant to Commission Rule 40.2(a)(3)(v), the following is a concise explanation and analysis of the product and its compliance with the Act, including the relevant Core Principles, and the Commission's regulations thereunder.

I. Introduction

The RTNGS Contract is a contract relating to the viewership of a given week of National Football League football. The NFL is the most popular sport in the United States and billions in advertising spending is spent on it each year. After careful analysis, Kalshi (hereafter referred to as "Exchange") has determined that the Contract complies with its vetting framework, which has been reviewed by the CFTC and formed part of the Exchange's application for designation as a Contract Market ("DCM") that was approved by the Commission.

Hundreds of millions of Americans tune in each year to watch NFL football. As a consequence, advertisers spent \$4.4 billion in television ads during NFL games in the 2020 season alone¹. This contract gives those brands and companies the ability to hedge against a sudden decline or increase in the sport's popularity, thus affecting how much and when to spend on advertising.

Further information about the Contract, including an analysis of its risk mitigation and price basing utility, as well as additional considerations related to the Contract, is included in Confidential Appendices B, C, and D.

Pursuant to Section 5c(c) of the Act and CFTC Regulations 40.2(a), the Exchange hereby certifies that the listing of the Contract complies with the Act and Commission regulations under the Act.

<u>General Contract Terms and Conditions:</u> The Contract operates similar to other binary contracts that the Exchange lists for trading. The minimum price fluctuation is \$0.01 (one

cent). Price bands will apply so that Contracts may only be listed at values of at least \$0.01 and at most \$0.99. Further, the Contract is sized with a one-dollar notional value and has a minimum price fluctuation of \$0.01 to enable Members to match the size of the contracts purchased to their economic risks. The Exchange has further imposed position limits (defined as maximum loss exposure) of \$25,000 USD on the Contract. As outlined in Rule 5.12 of the Rulebook, trading shall be available at all times outside of any maintenance windows, which will be announced in advance by the Exchange. Members will be charged fees in accordance with Rule 3.6 of the Rulebook. Fees are charged in such amounts as may be revised from time to time to be reflected on the Exchange's Website, Additionally, as outlined in Rule 7.2 of the Rulebook, if any event or any circumstance which may have a material impact on the reliability or transparency of a Contract's Source Agency or the Underlying related to the Contract arises, Kalshi retains the authority to designate a new Source Agency and Underlying for that Contract and to change any associated Contract specifications after the first day of trading. That new Source Agency and Underlying would be objective and verifiable. Kalshi would announce any such decision on its website. All instructions on how to access the Underlying are non-binding and are provided for convenience only and are not part of the binding Terms and Conditions of the Contract. They may be clarified at any time. Furthermore, the Contract's payout structure is characterized by the payment of an absolute amount to the holder of one side of the option and no payment to the counterparty. During the time that trading on the Contract is open, Members are able to adjust their positions and trade freely. After trading on the Contract has closed, the Expiration Value and Market Outcome are determined. The market is then settled by the Exchange, and the long position holders and short position holders are paid according to the Market Outcome. In this case, "long position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "Yes" side of the Contract and "short position holders" refers to Members who purchased the "No" side of the Contract. If the Market Outcome is "Yes," meaning that the number of domestic NFL viewers for <NFL week> is <greater than/less than> <value>, then the long position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the short position holders receive no payment. If the Market Outcome is "No," then the short position holders are paid an absolute amount proportional to the size of their position and the long position holders receive no payment. Specification of the circumstances that would trigger a Market Outcome of "Yes" are included below in the section titled "Payout Criterion" in Appendix A.

APPENDIX A – CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS TERMS OF CONTRACTS TRADED ON KALSHI

Contract: RTNGS

Contract: RTNGS

Scope: These rules shall apply to the RTNGS contract.

Underlying: The Underlying for this Contract is the number of weekly viewers in the United States for National Football League games according to MarketCast. If no data is provided, or there are no games played that week, the value of the Underlying is zero. Revisions to the Underlying made after Expiration will not be accounted for in determining the Expiration Value.

Source Agency: The Source Agency is MarketCast.

Type: The type of Contract is a Binary Contract.

Issuance: The Contract is based on the outcome of a recurrent data release, which is issued on a weekly basis. Thus, Contract iterations will be issued on a recurring basis, and future Contract iterations will generally correspond to the next week. The Issuance of the initial Contract will be on or after September 29, 2021.

<value>: Kalshi may list iterations of the Contract with <value> levels that fall within an inclusive range between a maximum value of <350,000,000> and a minimum value of <0> at consecutive increments of <1000>. Due to the potential for variability in the Underlying, the Exchange may modify <value> levels in response to suggestions by Members.

<NFL week>: <NFL week> refers to an NFL week specified by Kalshi. Kalshi may list iterations of the Contract corresponding to different statistical periods of <NFL week>, ranging from the week starting 2021 NFL Week Four (beginning September 30) through the final week of the 2023 NFL season. Weeks start on Thursday and end on Monday. Game viewership numbers are included for any game that starts during that period. Thus the viewership for the game that starts at 8:30 PM ET on Monday and ends at 12:30 AM ET on Tuesday is still included. Viewership from outside of this timeframe will not be included in the Expiration Value.

Payout Criterion: The Payout Criterion for the Contract encompasses the Expiration Values that are <greater than/less than> <value>.

Minimum Tick: The Minimum Tick size for the referred Contract shall be \$0.01.

Position Limit: The Position Limit for the \$1 referred Contract shall be \$25,000 per Member.

Last Trading Date: The Last Trading Date of the initial iteration of the Contract will be the same day as the Expiration Date. The Last Trading Time will be the same as the Expiration time.

Settlement Date: The Settlement Date of the initial iteration of the Contract shall be the day after the Expiration Date, unless the Market Outcome is under review pursuant to Rule 7.1.

Expiration Date: Unless otherwise noted by the Exchange and indicated on the Exchange website, the Expiration Date of the Contract shall be two days after the end of the <NFL week>. For example, the Expiration Date of the initial Contract will be Wednesday, October 6, 2021 because NFL Week Four ends on Monday, October 4, 2021.

Expiration time: The Expiration time of the initial Contract iteration shall be 5:00 PM ET.

Settlement Value: The Settlement Value for this Contract is \$1.00.

Expiration Value: The Expiration Value is the value of the Underlying for the statistical period of <NFL week> as documented by the Source Agency on the Expiration Date at the Expiration time.

Contingencies: Before Settlement, Kalshi may, at its sole discretion, initiate the Market Outcome Review Process pursuant to Rule 6.3(c) of the Rulebook. Additionally, as outlined in Rule 7.2 of the Rulebook, if any event or any circumstance which may have a material impact on the reliability or transparency of a Contract's Source Agency or the Underlying related to the Contract arises, Kalshi retains the authority to designate a new Source Agency and Underlying for that Contract and to change any associated Contract specifications after the first day of trading.
